of Juneteenth, when on June 19, 1865, Union Army General Gordon Granger rode into Galveston, Texas, and informed slaves of their emancipation -- more than two years after President Abraham Lincoln issued the Emancipation Proclamation on January 1, 1963.

In 2021, President Joe Biden signed a bill into law to officially designate Juneteenth as an American federal holiday, and the Korean Friendship Bell was rung for the first time on June 19th in its commemoration.
